




Aging Workforce



SAFE DRIVING MEDIA BLITZ

Based on the feedback from the survey in 2022, SWMS is in the process of developing a media campaign to help make residents more aware of our vehicles on the road through the use of advertising on Bus shelters, social media, radio and City vehicles that will promote safe driving around our vehicles.

ACCIDENT DATA COMPARING 2022 AND 2023 PERIOD OF JANUARY - JULY

14% decrease in overall accidents.

160% increase in mechanical arm accident as of June 30, 2023.

38% of our collisions are caused by backing up.

AUTOMATED ACCIDENTS

Ensure the arm is fully retracted into the body, prior to moving the vehicle.

Ensure the bin is positioned in a safe location as to not hit objects around the bin before collecting.



the area is clear.

Avoid Backing up whenever possible. If possible plan a route to avoid backing up.

If you are backing up by yourself make sure to get out and check behind the vehicle.




